Re: Revision to Directive on Policies Impacting Expressive Activities

### Dear Colleagues:

On August 19, 2024, I issued a Directive on Policies Impacting Expressive Activity, requesting each campus to compile and, if necessary, develop or amend policies that apply to protest and demonstration activity. As campuses have been reviewing and updating their policies to align with the directive, we've received feedback from campus administrative leaders, students, and faculty regarding the specific directive on masking to conceal identity and the need for clearer guidance in this area. To that end, I am issuing a revision to the directive to clarify this specific policy requirement.

# **Existing Directive**

Masking to conceal identity: Policies must clarify that no person shall wear a
mask or personal disguise or otherwise conceal their identity with the intent of
intimidating any person or group, or for the purpose of evading or escaping
discovery, recognition, or identification in the commission of violations of law
or policy.

# **Revised Directive**

Concealing identity when violating University policy or applicable laws: Policies
must clarify that wearing masks or face coverings is permissible for all persons
who are complying with University policies and applicable laws.

No person, while on University property, may conceal their identity or refuse to provide their identification for the purpose of evading or escaping discovery, recognition, or identification in the commission of violation of applicable University policy or local, state, or federal laws, including acts of unlawful intimidation or harassment of any person or group.

I appreciate the feedback we've received and believe this revised directive will help clarify this policy requirement across campuses. To further assist, we have posted an FAQ on our <u>campus climate website</u> to address questions related to the directives.

Providing clear guidance on our policies is essential to fostering an environment that balances free expression with safety.

As always, I appreciate your continued leadership and commitment to these efforts.
